WELCOME to this summer issue of the Clay Cross Town Centre Group News.

As this newsletter is being written, we are experiencing something of a heatwave with temperatures similar to those found in Europe adding a continental feel to our town, particularly the newly pedestrianised Market Street which is almost complete.

Well done to all the traders on Market Street who have continued to remain open as usual whilst the labour-intensive task of laying the paving blockwork has progressed from High Street to the Bridge Street junction.

Now that the majority of work has been completed, we are able to enjoy the benefits of a new open space which with the traditional kerbstones and pavements removed feels much wider and opens up the potential for organised community activities.

Meanwhile, the contractors who dealt with the pedestrianisation project have continued to the next phase of making a new entrance and exit from High Street to the existing Upper Market Street car park. This will allow a more convenient access to short stay parking for those using the main A61 road, particularly those visitors who are less familiar with the road layout in the town centre.

Upper Market Street continues to see new shops opening such as the Refillery at 20 Market Street which specialises in eco-friendly household cleaning products, non-bio laundry products and personal hygiene products such as soaps, bodywash, shampoos and conditioner. Not only are the products eco-friendly, your container can be refilled at the shop which minimises wastage.

Other trader news includes estate agents Pinewood Properties, who have recently opened their spacious new offices with a larger premises frontage at 21A Market Street, opposite their previous location.

Also T Nutt & Sons Flooring Centre on the High Street who received national recognition when they were given the Which? Trusted Trader Award for July, 2026. This brings great credit to their firm and boosts a positive identity for Clay Cross.

We must also mention Smiths Ice Cream on the High Street who recently featured on TV news as a long-established family business producing quality ice cream.

Other independent traders on the High Street include Bluebells & Balloons florists and retail outlets such as a baker's shop, a carpet shop, a post office and convenience store, a menswear shop, a specialist tearoom and a bridal shop.

There is also a music memorabilia shop, Becks Rock Box, which back in June organised a live music festival (Beck Fest) at Clay Cross Social Centre with various singers and rock and blues

bands. Well done to Ian Bexton (Beck) for making this enjoyable event happen.

At the southern end of High Street at the Clay Lane crossroads is The George for those who enjoy a gastro-pub dining experience.

Market Street traders include Taylors Corn Stores which stocks a range of artisan flours, pet foods

and pet supplies, and gardening items, and Clay Cross DIY which sells many everyday household, hardware and DIY items.

Other businesses include, Cash Dynamite which deals in new and pre-owned goods including a selection of collectable coins, affordable jewellery, video games, vinyl and 78 records and a variety of other pre-owned goods.

Towards the Market Street junction with Broadleys there is The Three Horseshoes bar and eatery, which operates in the daytime and evening, a newsagent and convenience store, a butchers, various hairstylists and beauticians, together with a selection of venues for lunches and snacks. On Broadleys there is Poppys cafe, which also operates a local delivery service.

Professional service firms include Bradley Morrell Solicitors at 1 The Mall, Clay Lane Legal Solicitors at 57 Market Street who specialise in residential conveyancing, trusts, wills and probate.

The Body Health Centre at Church View, Coney Green Road, offers sports massage, physiotherapy, chiropractic services and acupuncture, together with group therapy sessions such as yoga. Cleaver Thompson Solicitors, in Eyre Street, offer services including wills, probate and lasting powers of attorney.

The pedestrianisation of Upper Market Street has undoubtedly given the area a rejuvenated appearance and is raising optimism for the future amongst visitors and traders alike. We look forward to when work on Baileys Square resumes to complete the Clay Cross Town Deal project.
